Dearly Beloved-

February already? More than that- LENT ALREADY? Yes, saints of St. Paul's- Lent is nigh upon us. What with an early Easter (April 8th), that means an early Lent. This year, Ash Wednesday falls on February 18th. So, you can still get away with Valentine's Day chocolate- but just barely!

Lent is a time of preparation. In the ancient Church, it was in many places the final countdown for those Catechumens to receive their final instruction, before being baptized at the Easter Vigil. For those already within the bosom of the Church, it was a time of increased discipline: **"Thus, when you give to the needy... And when you pray... And when you fast... (Matt. 6)."**

1. Fasting: **"Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."** (**Duet. 8; Matt. 4**)
2. Prayer: **"Call upon me in the day of trouble..."** (**Ps. 50**); **"Pray then like this: Our Father in heaven..."** (**Matt 6**); **"Pray without ceasing"** (**1 Thess. 5**)
3. Almsgiving (Charity): **"Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you?'"** (**Matt. 25**)

And while it certainly disappointing (and not to mention unbiblical) that, over the centuries, these practices were in many ways corrupted – what with ideas of “meriting salvation”, to say nothing of other wonky and over-the-top idea – nevertheless, I would commend them to you. Just because they have been abused, it does not mean their original use is cancelled out. For you, dear Christian, there is freedom in the Gospel on how to approach these things.

But, what about for Lutherans? What is “our” Lenten practice, so to speak? Historically, it is two-fold:

- A. First, we spend extra time focusing on the Cross and Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. After all- a single Good Friday service (or even multiple!) isn't enough time to contemplate Christ's bittersweet



sufferings for us poor, miserable sinners.

B. Secondly, and following the pattern of the Early Church, Lent is often a time for renewed Catechesis, and a chance to dive once more into the Catechism.

To that end, I invite you all to join us as we begin an in-depth review of the Small Catechism, [beginning on the First Sunday in Lent \(Invocabit\), February 22nd](#). Whether you're old hand at it or could use a refresher- everyone is strongly encouraged to attend! Furthermore, if you've been looking for a reason to invite someone to church... well, here is a good excuse!

BUT! Don't just assume it'll be a familiar walk in the park. Don't think that we'll be just rambling our way through the Catechism.

Instead of merely opening and starting from "Page 1", this trek through the Catechism will address the Six Chief Parts according to the rhythm and flow of the Divine Service, and how we experience these things Sunday to Sunday. I won't say any more; you'll have to come and see for yourself!

Again, it all [starts on the First Sunday in Lent \(Invocabit\), February 22nd](#). I look forward to seeing y'all there- and, at the many opportunities that we'll have on Sundays and Wednesdays throughout Lent!

The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Love of God and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Table of Duties: The Forgotten Stewardship Tool

Luther's Small Catechism is a magnificent tool. Joined with a well-used copy of the Holy Scriptures and an orthodox hymnal, and the Christian is well equipped to live a life of faithfulness to the Lord and service to the neighbor. First in German and now in English and just about any language known to man, this handy masterpiece has introduced generations of people to the central doctrine of justification by grace, through faith, on account of Jesus Christ. The Six Chief Parts have proven to be a faithful framework for a clear confession of the truth of the Gospel for nearly five hundred years!

But more than a textbook, the Small Catechism also serves well as a handbook for Christian living. As a part of its treasure, there is an element that teaches an extraordinarily strong message of stewardship. That hidden treasure that needs to be rediscovered is called the Table of Duties.

The Table of Duties is really nothing more than a categorized gathering of Bible verses. These verses are set apart for "various holy orders and positions, admonishing them about their duties and responsibilities." Addressing pastors and people, government and citizens, husbands, wives, children, youth, workers and so many more, it very clearly lays out what faithful stewardship looks like. Even better, these assembled passages teach one important truth: we are stewards of one another!

The Table is much more than a "how-to" tool; it also lays out the interconnectedness that exists within the body of Christ. Pastors are described by what they are to be as stewards of the Word. 1 Timothy 3 highlights the characteristics of a faithful pastor. Even more, Titus 1 highlights the need for the pastor to be faithful for the sake of those under his care.

Those who hear the faithful preaching of the pastor are stewards of the pastor as well. 1 Corinthians 9 talks about the need for the people to support the livelihood of the pastor. Galatians 6 talks about how the hearers share in the good things that the pastor teaches. 1 Timothy 6 talks about the honor that is owed to the pastor, not because of WHO he is, but rather WHAT he is teaching! Hebrews 13 shows the impact of this stewardship on the pastor, that they perform their duties with joy. Joyful pastors and people are always going to be better stewards of the Gospel!

Outside the church this interdependent stewardship is on display as well. Romans 13 highlights the respect necessary for the governing authorities. As citizens, the faithful steward is called to pay taxes (Matthew 22), pray for their leaders (1 Timothy 2) and that they should be ready to serve in the civil realm (Titus 3), because they are in these positions by God's direction (1 Peter 2).

These steward duties are in the home too! 1 Peter 3 and Colossians 3 shape the husband steward. Ephesians 5 and 1 Peter 3 shape the wife steward. Ephesians 6 form parental stewards and child stewards.

The Table of Duties is a wonderful place for the individual steward to learn how much our stewardship is more than just a "me and Jesus thing!" In fact, it ends with these words: "Let each his lesson learn with care, and all the household well share fare." This is interdependent stewardship on clear display. As each learns stewardship in this way, the more faithful we will be as a family, congregations, communities and the church at large.
